Community Urgent Eye Care Scheme (CUES)

The CUES service is a free NHS service for anyone experiencing emergency eye care problems such as

- red painful swollen eye or eyelids
- recently occurring flashes and floaters
- recent and sudden loss of vision
- a foreign body in the eye.

If you ring for an emergency appointment for an eye problem you may be signposted to a local participating optician who have specialist equipment to check the eyes
